Before the pandemic, 40% of non-elderly adults reported difficulty meeting basic needs such as food, healthcare, housing, and utilities (47% in Marion County).

Now 69% of Americans living in poverty have been food insecure or are unable to afford housing. These adults have children who struggle to get to school each day. Will you help? #JLOwearsLBD

January 24th - January 28th, JLO is participating in *The Little Black Dress Initiative*. Quick Facts:

28.2% of children in Marion County live in poverty; 21.3% of children in Florida live in poverty (1)

14.4% of the Marion County population was considered to be food insecure before the pandemic. People experiencing food insecurity often consume a nutrient-poor diet, which may contribute to the development of obesity, heart disease, hypertension, diabetes, and other chronic diseases. (2)

"Poverty reduces a child's readiness for school because it leads to poor physical health and motor skills, diminishes a child's ability to concentrate and remember information, and reduces attentiveness, curiosity and motivation." (3)

Even before the pandemic, 47% of Marion County households were struggling to afford basic housing, healthcare, and food. (4)

More than 60% of low-income families do not have access to books. (5)

Approximately 59,000 Marion County residents are living in poverty. (6)
